4.0 ONLINE MEDIA

4.1 Social Media

Cite only original content from social media sites such as Twitter, Facebook, Reddit, Instagram, and more. That is, if you used social media to discover content (e.g., you found a link to a blog post on Pinterest or Twitter) and you want to cite the content, cite it directly - it is not necessary to mention that you found it through a link on social media.

Social media posts may contain text only, text with audiovisuals (e.g., photos, videos), or audiovisuals alone. Include the text of a social media post up to the first 20 words. Note the presence of audiovisuals (in square brackets) after the text of the post.

Social media posts might also contain nonstandard spelling and capitalization, hashtags, links, and emojis. Do not alter the spelling and capitalization in a social media reference. Retain hashtags and links. Replicate emojis, if possible. If you are not able to create emoji, provide the emoji's name in square brackets, for example, "[face with tears of joy emoji]". The full list of emoji names can be found on the Unicode Consortium's website (<http://unicode.org/emoji/charts/index.html>). When counting the number of words in your paper, count an emoji as one word.

4.2 Webpages and Websites

Use the webpages and websites category if there is no other reference category that fits and the work has no parent or overarching publication (e.g., journal, blog, conference proceedings) other than the website itself. If you site multiple webpages from a website, create a reference for each. To mention a website in general, do not create a reference list entry or an in-text citation. Instead, include the name of the website in the text and provide the URL in parentheses.
